Sunflowers at the ready! Science lessons in the community.

Students took a little stroll to our wonderful Bridgewood Trust Horticulture centre where we continue to form positive links in the community as part of their science lesson to identify different flowers and plants. They choose their sunflowers, interacted with the horticulture staff, including one of our students demonstrating sign-language to one of the centres' staff. Bridgewood are



















keen to develop work experience links with us when our students are old enough, which is fantastic news. Great community development in the local area.

Science Squishies

During Science Crystal class were really excited about the "Squishy kits" that arrived for their science lesson. Students were able to design and create their own squishies and one student decided to create his own PRIDE squishy – very imaginative. As well as provide creativity and imagination they're also great as a sensory item.







Striking and Fielding

Students helped unpack the huge delivery of new PE equipment ready for the summer term's PE lessons and showed great teamwork and following instructions from staff. This term they are focussing on striking and fielding and have shown excellent engagement in learning and taking part in cricket lessons, which is also helping develop their communication skills with each other as well. Our students love the new swing ball in the quiet area of the outside courtyard as well.



Change over times in History.

Crystal and Diamond have enjoyed learning how monarchs have changed over time from King John to the Magna Carter. They have used mathematical skills in plotting timelines, creative

thinking or key figures and discussions around each key person, the role, effect and impact.

Reading and World Beliefs outside in the sun: Our woodland outside area is a wonderful place to be for quiet reading in a calm space where squirrels enjoy playing and gathering food. One of our students sourced natural materials to replicate religious symbols

This term students are learning and developing their coding and programming skills during their computing lessons using Kodu and Scratch which are excellent pieces of software that

The focus for this term has been on non-fiction. Students have engaged really well understanding the differences between fiction and non-fiction with their personalised choice of non-fiction as their own focus for the summer 2 term. Students have also demonstrated some good progress in understanding different types of writing, from writing a set of instructions to make a jam and ham sandwich to writing a letter to the school to make a request.
